## **Community Docs and Mather to Open Ambulatory Surgery Center**



Some of the 19 community surgeons and Mather Administration attended the recent groundbreaking for the Port Jefferson Ambulatory Surgery Center.

A group of 19 community surgeons in partnership with Mather Hospital and Pinnacle III, a company that has developed ambulatory surgery centers nationwide, will open the freestanding Port Jefferson Ambulatory Surgery Center in Port Jefferson Station. A groundbreaking ceremony for the center was held on November 22 at Washington Professional Office Park in Port Jefferson Station.

The project, estimated to cost \$12 million, will have six operating rooms equipped to handle procedures in orthopedics, ophthalmology, pain management, general surgery, neurosurgery and otolaryngology. The Center is expected to open in 12-16 months.

"There is a growing need for this type of facility, which is less expensive to run than a hospital. This translates to cost savings for patients and the healthcare system," said Michael Fracchia, MD, Director of Orthopedics at Mather and one of the physician partners in the venture. The new center will also free up operating rooms at Mather Hospital for more complex procedures that require a hospital stay.

"The new ambulatory surgery center will provide a comfortable setting that will be convenient for patients," said orthopedic surgeon Brian McGinley, MD, president of the project.

Colorado-based Pinnacle III has successfully facilitated the opening of ambulatory surgery centers nationwide. The Port Jefferson Ambulatory Surgery Center would be its first in New York State.



## President's Column

As 2016 comes to a close we can look back on the many changes at Mather and in the healthcare industry, with more to come in the New Year.

This year we welcomed new residency programs in Psychiatry and Radiology. Together with our existing Internal Medicine and Transitional Year residency programs, we now have 70 residents at Mather. We recently broke ground for a new freestanding ambulatory surgery center in which Mather is a partner along with

19 community surgeons and Pinnacle III, the developer/manager of the facility. The center will have six operating rooms equipped to handle procedures in orthopedics, ophthalmology, pain management, general surgery, neurosurgery and otolaryngology. We are continuing our affiliation discussions with four healthcare organizations- Catholic Health System, Mount Sinai, Northwell Health, and Stony Brook Medicine as we continue to be active participants as a member of the 10-hospital Long Island Healthcare Network (LIHN).

Among our 2016 accomplishments was being named the only Long Island hospital to receive a four-star rating from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services for patient experience, safety and timely and effective care based on publicly reported data. We were also rated among the best hospitals in New York State in *U.S. News & World Report's* annual Best Hospitals rankings. Mather was ranked 19th out of almost 250 hospitals in New York State and was rated as "high performing" for four procedures/conditions – abdominal aortic aneurism repair, COPD, colon cancer surgery and heart failure. *Long Island Business News* named us Hospital of the Year for 2016. Our Transitional Care Unit again received the top five-star rating from *U.S. News*' Best Nursing Homes ratings. But our streak of 9 consecutive A's for hospital safety ended when we were given a C rating from The Leapfrog Group. This is partly due to changes in the Leapfrog survey, and highlights opportunities to improve patient safety and the delivery of care. You will see an even greater emphasis on becoming a high reliability organization (HRO) next year.

**Michael Fishkin, DO** and **Jacob Sokol, MD** were named Physician Advisors for the Clinical Documentation Improvement (CDI) program.

Michael Tofano, MD was named Program Director of the Internal Medicine Residency Program. Imtiaz Khokhar, MD was named Director of Hospital Medicine at Mather.

We also congratulate **Tracey Merritt**, who is now working as our full-time in-house Legal Counsel. It is with great sadness and shock that we lost **Maryanne Gordon**, Administrative Director of the Professional & Regulatory Department. Maryanne had been a Mather employee for more than 38 years - almost her entire career. She was responsible for guiding us through numerous Joint Commission and Department of Health surveys. Her husband Dennis and son Adam are both Mather employees. We extend our deepest sympathies to them and the entire Gordon family and we will miss her tremendously. **Service**

In this culture, every person is aware and engaged in creating a culture of safety, and makes use of experts to get it right. We will look at various processes we use to provide healthcare and examine ways to reduce the possibility of an error occurring in each step of those processes. This involves all of us, so if you see something, say something. **Innovation and Growth** 

In 2017, the Sleep Center will relocate to the first floor of the Medical Arts Building and increase the number of sleep beds from 6 to 8. Thank you all for your continuing efforts at Mather. Plans are underway to begin a Family Medicine Residency Program as we continue to grow our Graduate Medical Education teaching programs.

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






### **Adelphi Student Nurses**

## VOYAGE matters Holiday Decorating

Church, Long Island Cares and General Needs, an organization that provides new items to L.I. veterans and their families.





### Mather is First LI Hospital to Use Thermal Storage for Cooling

Mather is the first Long Island hospital to install a thermal (ice) storage system to help with cooling the hospital during warmer months. The new system, which is expected to be operational this summer, will shift a portion of the hospital's peak electrical load from daytime to nighttime when electricity is more plentiful, less expensive and generated more efficiently, and will reduce consumption and peak demand.

"By incorporating an ice thermal storage system into Mather Hospital's chiller plant operations, we are expected to reduce our peak energy demand usage by 20 percent," said Kevin Koubek, Mather's Director of Engineering, Design and Construction. "By shifting our higher electrical demand to the overnight hours (when we would be generating ice), we are able to take advantage of the lower off-peak electric rates."

Ice storage technology, similar to the system being installed at Mather, is a form of energy storage where the consumption of a customer's electricity is shifted into the nighttime hours where energy is stored each night by using specialized air conditioning units to freeze large tanks of water into ice. During the day, the stored energy (in the form of ice) is then discharged (melted) in coordination with the traditional air conditioning systems to provide cooling without having to use large amounts of power when the grid is the most stressed. As a result, air conditioning is provided during the day to a building's occupants with energy that was consumed the night before.

PSEG Long Island preapproved a rebate of approximately \$1 million to Mather to help fund the system's installation under the Commercial Efficiency Program.

### Study Compares Laparoscopic and Robotic-Assisted Hernia Surgery

Arif Ahmad, MD, Director of the Center of Excellence in Metabolic & Bariatric and Robotic Surgery TM, conducted a study comparing the outcomes of robotic-assisted inguinal (groin) hernia repair surgery versus laparoscopic surgery. The study was presented at the Second Annual Global Symposium on Robotic-Assisted and Minimally Invasive Hernia Repair.

A retrospective review was conducted of 103 inguinal hernia repairs in 84 consecutive patients. Of those, 52 were robotic assisted and 51 were laparoscopic. All were performed by a single surgical group at Mather Hospital between January 2015 and July 2016. No significant differences in the outcomes of the two groups were found with estimated blood loss, recovery room stay duration, postoperative pain scores or procedure cost. The operative time as longer with the robotic assisted hernia repair, but only found to be statistically significant with bilateral hernia repair.

Dr. Ahmad and his team concluded that robotic-assisted inguinal hernia repair is a feasible and cost effective treatment option for inguinal hernias. However, long term follow up may reveal other differences in outcomes that may be of importance. The study was approved by Mather Hospital's Institutional Review Board (IRB) in October 2016.

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




